## MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD

In 2016, the board continued to focus on providing guidance and support to staff and shelter residents. Board members contribute time and talent as well as actively participate in fundraising endeavors. Progressive dinners were held in Pine City, Sandstone and Rush City. While progressive dinners provide a small but necessary source of income, it is also an excellent opportunity to educate and inform communities about A Place for You.

The gala was successful and contributed 17% of the shelter's income. Financial support continues to be a challenge for the shelter; however, the board is committed to researching business op-

portunities that will provide long-term sustainability. Meanwhile grants from various organizations provided washers and dryers for the men and women's sections and a much needed freezer. We also received a HUD grant which provides 39% of the shelter's income. In an effort to raise awareness in the communities we serve, an outreach was conducted to churches as well as several organizations. Last year we reported that the majority of our income was from Pine County and that our goal for 2016 was to obtain funding from the 5 other counties. We are pleased that all counties have joined our efforts in helping people transition from homelessness to independent living, especially Chisago County.

More than 1,100 people have contacted A Place for You since its inception four years ago. The shelter has been a place of refuge and hope for those in a desolate place. Your support and contributions are so greatly appreciated. We continue to embrace our mission which is to "empower the homeless to transition into a more stable future."



## **MISSION:**

A Place For You Transitional Shelter serves as a safe place for people in distress. We provide for basic needs and offer resources that give lifechanging alternatives to residents while respecting the inherent goodness and dignity of each individual.

## VISION:

A community where everyone has the resources necessary to maintain safe and stable housing.

## **PURPOSE:**

To supply the basic human need of shelter to those finding themselves homeless and to assist them with finding affordable, permanent housing. To provide a safe environment for clients to evaluate their current situation and plan for self-sufficiency.

Reflecting on the past year is empowering and insightful. In 2016 we had several successes and identified areas where we need to work harder. We served more people and received more calls for service than ever. Our budget, though tight, did balance at the end of the year. We have had many successful residents. One that comes to mind, came to us after having been homeless for 8 years. He was a hard worker and went the extra mile taking care of the grounds while he was here. He obtained a job not long after he arrived and was able to purchase a mobile home to move into when he left the shelter. The trailer needed work but I have no doubt he fixed it up and had a comfortable winter. I know he continues today with the same employer.

We received calls from people in the community and businesses who had wonderful

feedback. One company called and said we are easy to work with and provide a good service and they would like to help fund us and invited me to meet with their board. Another caller asked for our address because she wants to support local missions. She had learned about our agency and wanted to support us. Our network is growing but we still have a lot of work to do. We continue to operate on a shoe string budget and have ongoing building maintenance and operating costs.

In 2016 we have worked toward becoming selfsustainable. We have looked at several options to bring sustainable funding into A Place for You. Some of our ideas were great but came with too many barriers to be successful. Other ideas would not have achieved the return on investment that we need. We will continue to work toward this goal in 2017.

Another success we had in 2016 is low turn-over in staff. We have been providing ongoing training and are working hard to give staff the tools they need to be the best employee they can be. We are recognizing their strengths and building on them. We did struggle for a time with my being out on medical leave for three months. But because of the great staff we have and the supportive board of directors the shelter continued to provide excellent service. Going into 2017 our hope is to continue to gain support for A Place for You. We will continue to leverage grant dollars, Group Residential Housing Funding, FEMA Funding, HUD and other resources. Watch for the "letter to the editor" in your local paper.

3 **Progressive Dinners** held by 10 churches collectively raised over \$4800 to benefit operating expenses of A Place for You.

First Lutheran, St John's Lutheran and Sacred Heart Catholic in Rush City celebrated with a *Mama Mia Italian dinner*. It was an evening of warm hospitality while sharing success stories of residents at APFY.

A Scandinavian dinner was sponsored by Immaculate Conception Catholic, Our Redeemer Lutheran and Evangelical Free Church in Pine City. Shelter volunteers at each church visited with diners and provided updates on how money raised would assist specific shelter projects. Sandstone churches hosted Around the World with chefs from United Church of Christ, Grace Lutheran, St Luke's Catholic and Evangelical Free

Church. As in the past, there was a lot of delicious food accompanied by authentic decorations representing each country—and a whole lot of fellowship.

We are grateful for the support of each of these commu-

nities of faith for their attention to the needs of those less fortunate. In our corner of East Central MN we are blessed to not only benefit from the best cooks in the area but also the most inspiring fellowship.
